

How do I get my restricted permit if the Judge said that I was eligible?

1. The Judge may indicate that you can **apply** for a Restricted Driving Permit at your sentencing hearing.
2. If you have an out of state license, then you are not eligible for a Restricted Driving Permit in Idaho. Please consult your attorney or the Idaho Department of Transportation at 208-334-8735, option 1.
3. The Blaine County Probation Department obtains information that the court uses in deciding whether to issue the Restricted Driving Permit.
4. In order to get the process started, the Blaine County Probation Department Staff needs the following information:
 - A Judgment of Conviction signed by the Magistrate Judge that provides information regarding if or when and individual may be eligible for a restricted permit
 - Confirmation from the Idaho Department of Transportation (a probation department staff member will make the contact) to ensure that there are no other restrictions on your license.
5. The probation officer will also need you to provide:
 - Verification of insurance
 - A completed Employment Verification Sheet
6. The Blaine County Probation Department will use this information to request a Restricted Driving Permit.
7. This proposed permit is filed with the court. Please be aware that it is unlikely that you will receive a permit on the same day that it is filed.
8. The Judge reviews that proposed order, signs if appropriate and returns it to the Court Clerk's Office to be sent out to you.
9. Your Restricted Driving Permit may be hand delivered to you by the probation department, but this is not always possible.
10. Please speak to a probation officer if you have any questions regarding this process.
